

Make your own versatile stropping block with a piece of  $1'' \ge 4''$  lumber, a sheet of 600 grit wet/dry paper, a piece of thin leather, a piece of 2mm leather lace and a 1/8'' strip of 8/9 oz. Cowhide. Works great for sharpening and honing all knives, especially hard to sharpen edge bevelers.



**3.** Cement a piece of thin leather to the block up to the third line as shown.



**6.** Cement 2mm round leather lace and 1/8" leather strip to block. Allow cement to dry and trim both edges of 1/8" strip with a #3 edge beveler.



SHARPEN AND HONE SWIVEL KNIVES, EDGE BEVELERS AND KNIVES OF ALL KINDS.



**1.** Attach a piece of 600 Grit Wet/Dry sandpaper to one side of the block as shown.



**4.** Trim excess leather with a stencil knife.



**7.** Trim ends of both pieces of lace flush with the end of the block.



**2.** Mark 3 parallel lines 1/2" from one edge and 1/2" apart.



**5.** Apply a bead of leathercraft cement to the other two lines as shown.



**8.** Apply jewelers rouge to both pieces of lace and leather. Your block is now ready to use.
